



Managing Successful Programmes (MSP) Foundation and Practitioner

Course Overview

MSP is a globally recognised framework for best practice programme management. MSP is specifically designed to address the most common challenges that organizations encounter when leading investments in change. It is designed to align programmes and projects to organizational strategy and to provide governance. It focuses on the outcomes of benefit, whilst mitigating risks and actively engaging stakeholders. This course includes both MSP examinations, and all course materials to prepare you fully.

This is an intensive course and please ensure you can commit the time to it. The structure of your course is:

- Pre Course Learning: approx. 5 hours in advance of your course
- 5 day course: 35 hours
- Evening work: 8-10 hours doing mock exam questions
- Exams:
 - Foundation (taken in your own time following day 3): multiple choice, 60 questions, 36 correct answers (60%) to pass, 1 hour, closed book
 - Practitioner (taken in your own time following the course): 2.5 hours, open-book (the official MSP manual only), 70 questions, 42 marks to pass (60%)

Please note: it is a requirement to have passed Foundation before your Practitioner results will be released.
